ABOUT

The Phoenix Center is the designated county authority for the prevention and treatment of substance use disorders in Greenville County. With a person and family centered approach, we treat each individual based on the needs identified during the assessment and treatment planning process. Staff interact with clients in a positive, encouraging, and non-judgmental manner to support them through every stage in the treatment process. Utilizing an array of evidence based practices, we treat substance use disorders in a holistic manner through the use of traditional therapy such as group, family, and individual counseling. We also utilize Medication Assisted Therapy and 12-Step recovery groups to build a network of support.

PREVENTION

Prevention services are designed to help Greenville County residents of all ages avoid the dangers of using alcohol, tobacco, and other drugs. We strive to keep young people from experimenting with these substances and to prevent the development of subsequent problems.

Adult Outpatient Services

Adult Outpatient Services provide education and treatment programs on an individual or group basis.

These programs are individualized to meet the needs of the client. Adult Outpatient Services are available days, evenings, and some weekends. Services include individual and group counseling, individual treatment plan, family sessions, life skills, and drug screening.

Other Adult Outpatient programs include DUI Curriculum (ADSAP), DOT Program, Offender Based Intervention, Medication Assisted Treatment (Suboxone/Vivitrol), Gambling Addiction Counseling, Work Force Assistance, and Nursing Services. Rapid HIV testing and referral services are available.

Adult Residential

The Adult Residential Program is a 30-day program for adults age 18

and older with a substance use disorder. Residents receive 6 hours of intensive treatment each day, are introduced to the recovery community, and receive medical support throughout their stay.

Medical Detoxification

Services are available for adults age 18 and older. Medical supervision provided 24 hours a day, 7 days a week by licensed staff. Primary focus on withdrawal management related to alcohol, opioids, and benzodiazepines. Case management and referral services provided to ensure continuity of care following discharge. Rapid HIV testing and referral available.

Adolescent Services

Our counselors work with adolescents, ages 7-17, who are involved in substance use or at risk due to other issues, including



family problems. We do this through individual sessions, group counseling, family therapy, mental health screenings, art & music therapy, life skills development, and anger management. All of these work to help the adolescent progress through the treatment plan, towards recovery and a healthy life.

Women's Residential at Serenity Place

The Women's Residential program at Serenity Place provides treatment for females age 18 or older with a substance use disorder who are pregnant and/



or who have at least one child who is able to enter the program and reside on-site with her at Serenity Place. Services include individual counseling, group counseling, family counseling, and parent/child bonding. Rapid HIV testing and referral available.

Circle of Friends at Serenity Village



Circle of Friends provides services to infants, toddlers and pre-school children under the age of 7 who are not yet eligible for first grade. Specialized services address

physical, behavioral, emotional, social, and cognitive delays. A standardized screening tool and individual service plan are implemented in partnership between staff and the child's mother, utilizing the Nurturing Parenting curriculum.
