I. Client Services (Excluding Prevention)

Total Number of Persons Served – During the 1st quarter of FY 10, new admissions continue to account for at least 50% of total admissions. First quarter numbers are consistent with previous quarters with slightly higher intakes, admissions, and discharges from the 1st quarter of FY 09.

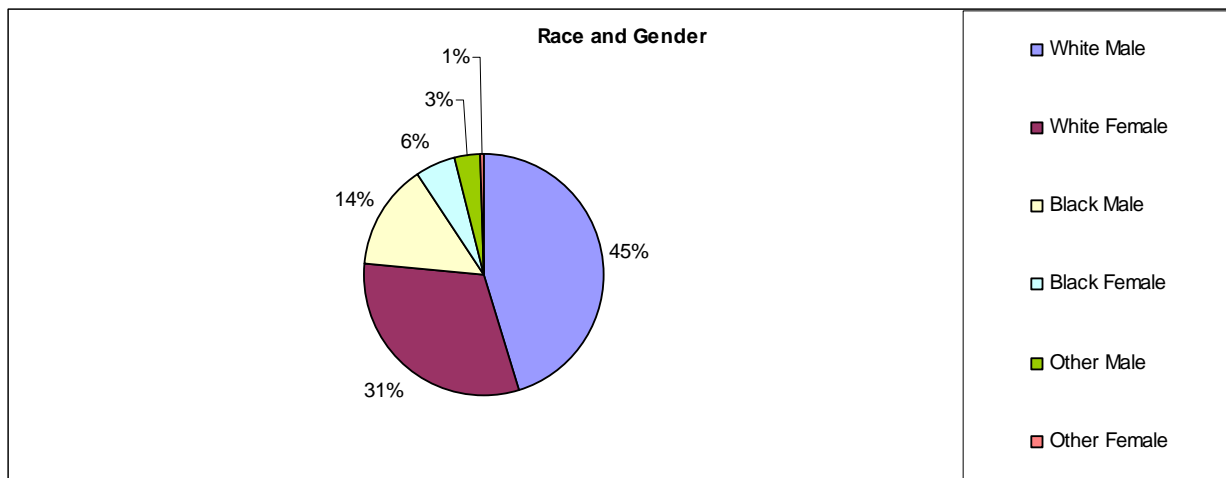
Number of Persons Served by Program – For the 1st quarter, Adult Outpatient accounted for 33% of the total number of persons served. ADSAP accounted for 36%. For 57% of ADSAP admissions, educational curriculum was the recommendation for services. These percentages are generally consistent across quarters.

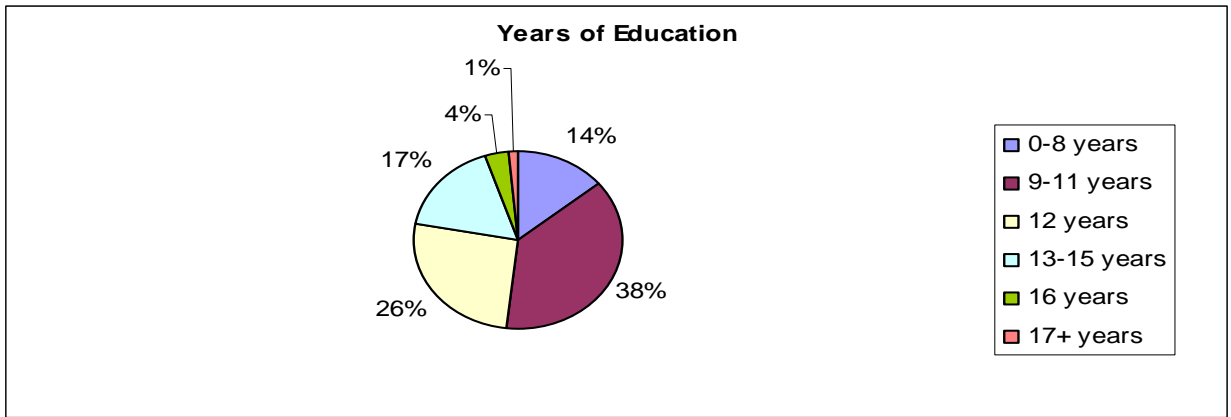
Client Demographics for 1st Quarter FY 10*

Race and Gender – White males consistently comprise the greatest percentage of individuals who enter services with 45% this quarter. Overall, 62% of clients were identified as male and 76% were identified as white.



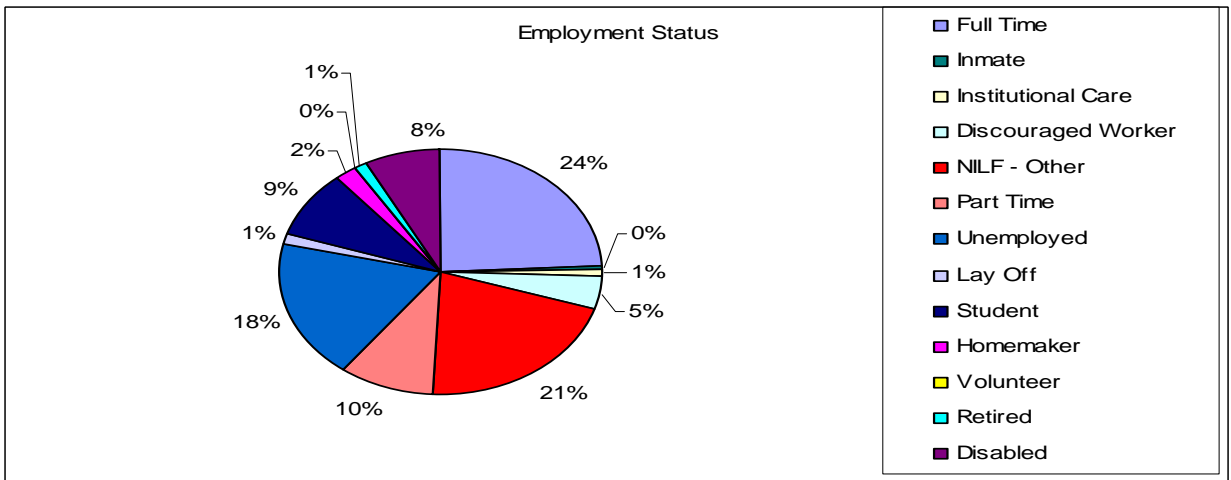

Education – The largest percentage of clients report 9-11 years of education. Nearly 50% of individuals report 12 or more years of education with the highest percentage being 12 years.



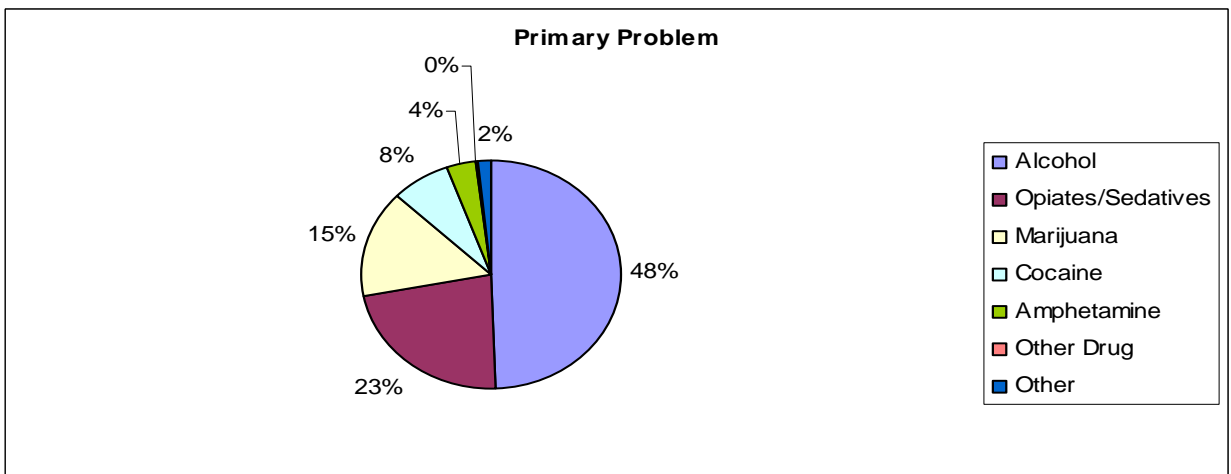

Employment – Only 24% of individuals report full time employment. Nearly 55% fall into one of the following categories: discouraged worker, NILF – other, unemployed, lay off.

Primary Problem – Alcohol remains the primary problem at admission. As a group, opiates have the next largest percentage. Although amphetamines only account for 4%, methamphetamine is the primary problem for 35 of the 41 individuals with a primary problem of amphetamine.
