**I. Client Services (Excluding Prevention)**

***Total Number of Persons Served*** – Intakes, Admissions, Discharges, and Total Served continue to increase. First entries continue to account for at least 50% of the admissions. The total number of clients served has increased nearly 60% from Fiscal Year 2004 to Fiscal Year 2010.

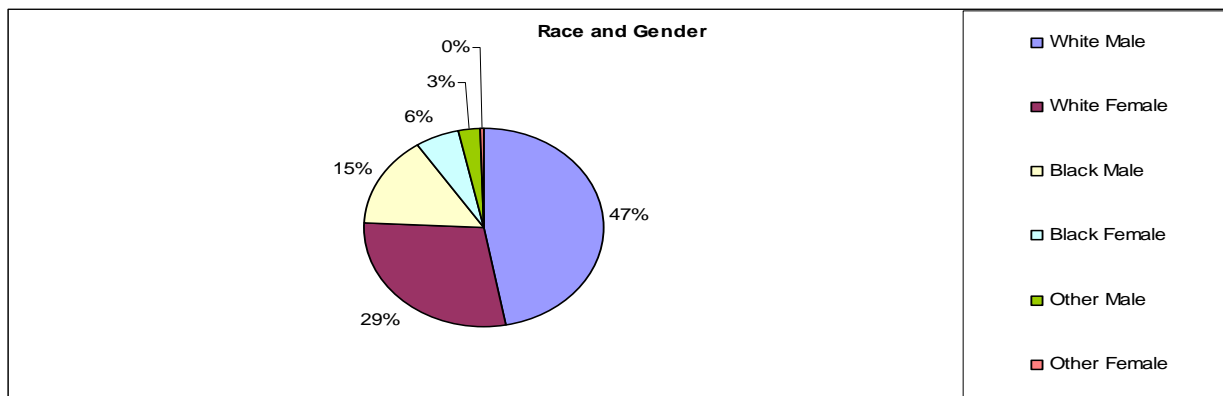
***Number of Persons Served by Program*** – ADSAP clients continue to account for the largest percentage of clients served at 36%, followed by Adult OPS with 29% and Detoxification with 22%. For ADSAP clients, at least 41% of the total served received treatment services.

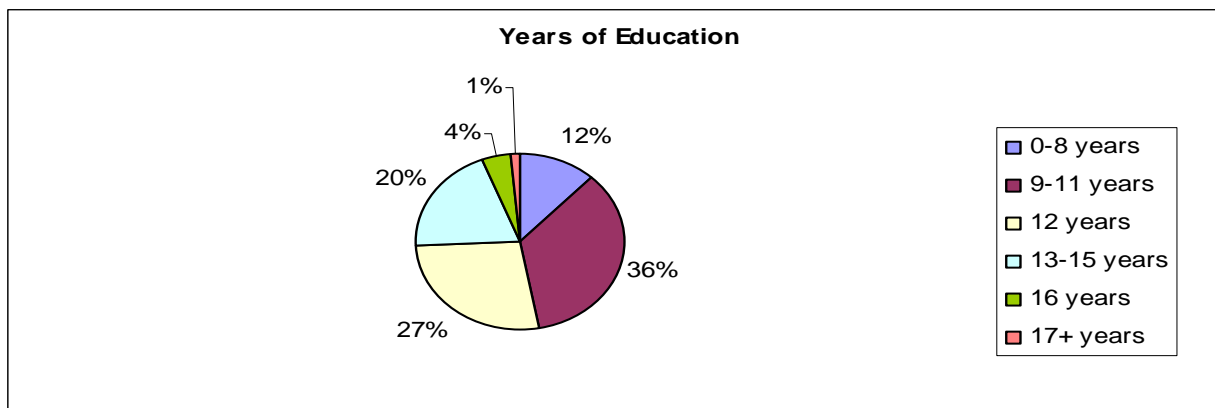
**Client Demographics for FY 10\***

**Race and Gender** – White males consistently comprise the greatest percentage of individuals who enter services with 47% this fiscal year. Overall, 65% of clients were identified as male and 76% were identified as white.



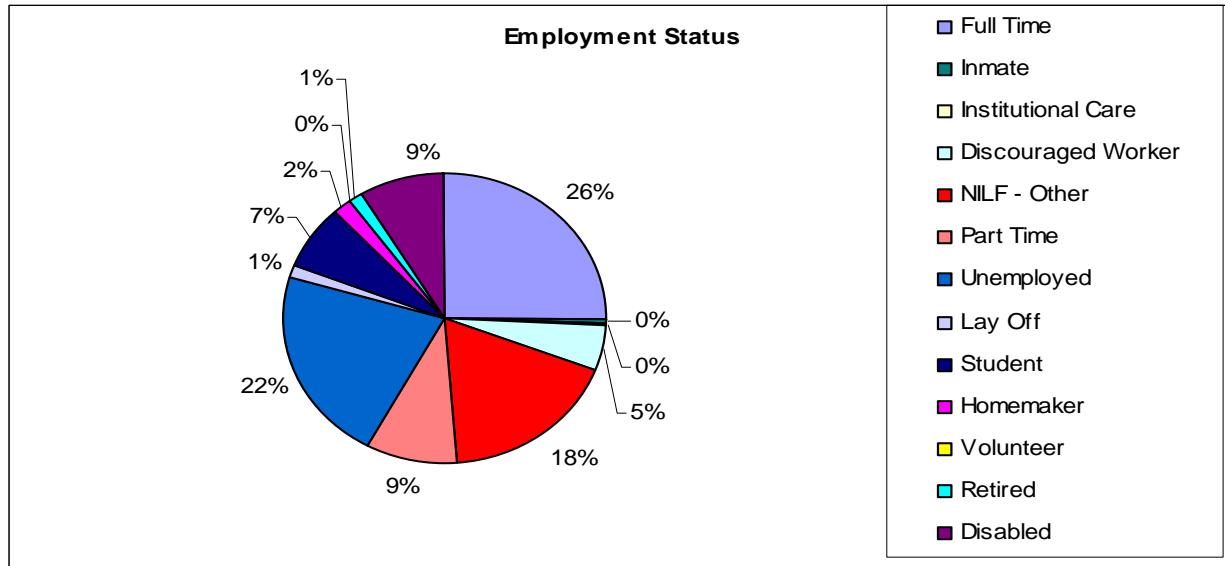

**Education** – The largest percentage of clients report 9-11 years of education. Slightly more than 50% of individuals report 12 or more years of education.



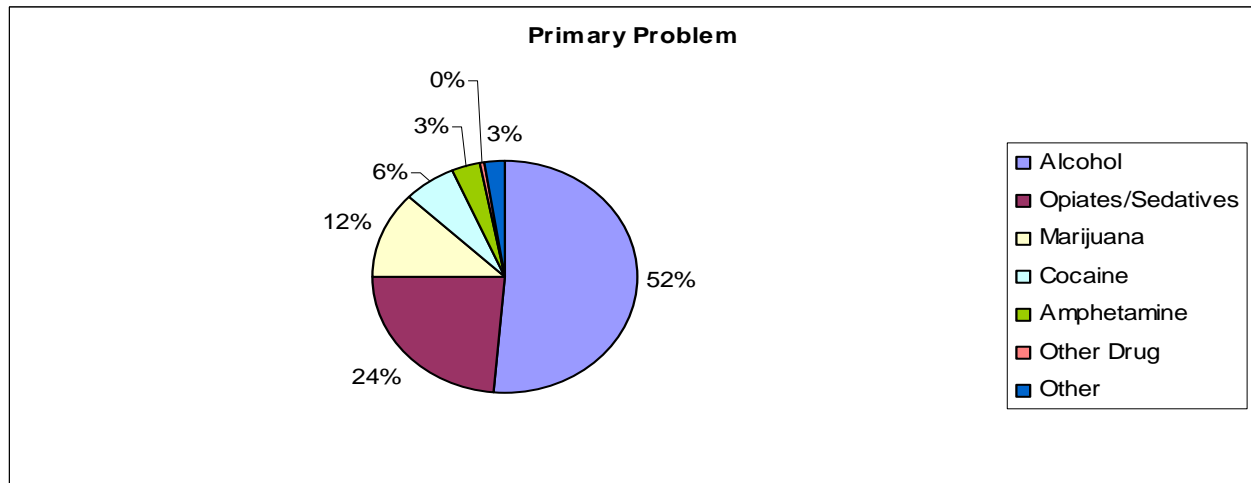

**Employment** – Only 26% of individuals report full time employment. Nearly 55% fall into one of the following categories: discouraged worker, NILF – other, unemployed, lay off.

**Primary Problem** – Alcohol remains the primary problem at admission. As a group, opiates have the next largest percentage. Although amphetamines only account for 3%, methamphetamine is the primary problem for 127 of the 145 individuals with a primary problem of amphetamine.
